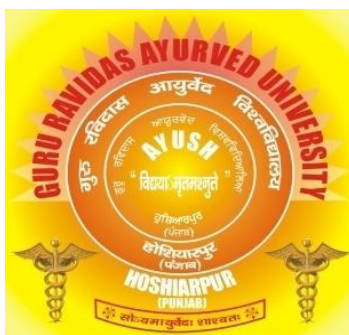

Note:

- The qualifying examinations of 10th and 10+2 (Senior Secondary) shall be accepted only if they have been passed from a Board recognized by the Central Government or a State Government, or established under an Act of Parliament, an Act of a State Legislature, or by an Executive Order of the Central/State Government. Any qualification obtained from a Board that is not so recognized shall not be accepted for admission.
- Allocation of seat is provisional subject to verification of original documents/ checking of eligibility by the Principal of the concerned Ayurvedic/Homoeopathy Colleges. It is the responsibility of the Principal to authenticate the eligibility of the provisionally allocated candidates before their joining/admission.
- When a candidate surrenders the seat allotted in any course being conducted under the affiliation of Guru Ravidas Ayurved University, after completion of the admission process, such candidate shall be liable to pay the entire course fee.

Important Instructions (PLEASE READ IN DETAIL)

1. Eligibility and qualifications will be as per Punjab Govt. Notification No.5/3/2011-5HBIII/3042 dated:09.11.2022 and other corrigendum's. **Candidates must be NEET UG-2026 qualified.**
2. Distribution of seats will be as per Punjab Govt. Notification, the list of eligible colleges/seats may increase/decrease, subject to the orders of Hon'ble Courts/NCISM/NCH /Govt. The final list of seats will be displayed at the time of counselling.
3. **Correction(s) In Online Registration/Counselling** In case candidate wants to make any change in his/her online form , he/she can do the same by logging on again in his/her online application form by using the password provided by the University on or before the last date for submission of form. Online Admission Application Form will be locked automatically after the cut-off date for submission of online admission application form. No request for any correction in admission application form will be considered thereafter. Filling more than one form by one candidate may cause cancellation of the candidature.
4. Candidates of category of **Scheduled Caste (Category Code 12), Backward Classes (Category Code 13), Schedule Tribe (Category Code 33), Other Backward Classes (Category Code 35)** will report at the allotted college along with original certificate for physical verification of documents and checking of eligibility.
5. **Sports Category Candidates:-**The candidates who applied under Sports Category (Category Code 17), will submit printed/hard copy of online submitted form **personally (by hand)** in the allocated college along with Sports Gradation Certificate issued by the Director, Sports, Punjab and other supporting self attested copies of certificates/documents.
6. Candidates of category Backward Area (Category code 14), Border Area (Category Code 15), Physically Handicapped (Category Code 16), Riot/terrorist affected (Category Codes- 18(1), 18(2), 19, 20(1), 20(2), 21) and Freedom Fighter (Category Code 31) **will report at allocated college along with original certificate** for physical verification of documents and checking of eligibility .
7. Candidates of categories wards of defense personnel (Category Code 22 to 27), wards of Punjab Police Personnel, Punjab Armed Police, Punjab Home Guards and Para-Military Forces (Category Codes-28 to 30) and Migrants from Jammu & Kashmir due to terrorist violence (Category Code 32) **will report at allocated college along with original certificate** for physical verification of documents and checking of eligibility.
8. Candidates of category of **Economically Weaker Sections (Category Code 34)** will report at the allotted college along with original certificate for physical verification of document issued from the **office of Tehsildar** for checking of eligibility.
9. Allocation of seat is provisional subject to verification of original documents/checking of eligibility by the Principal of concerned Ayurvedic/Homoeopathy/Unani Colleges. It is the sole responsibility of the Principal to authenticate the eligibility of the provisionally allocated candidates before their joining/admission.
10. Correct category must be filled carefully in the online application form. No claim shall be allowed if category/categories are not indicated in online application form. Only those candidates who claim Reservation by filling categories code in online application form shall be considered for reserved seat.
11. After last date of submission of online Registration Form, no request will be entertained for any change therein.
12. Only registered candidates are eligible for the counselling(s) and without registration, none of candidates is allowed for the counselling (online).
13. 15% seats are of All India Quota and remaining 85% seats are of State Quota.
14. **Candidates applying for 15% of All India Quota seats should go through the guidelines for All India Quota Private UG & PG seats for academic year 2026-27.**

INTRODUCTION

BRIEF HISTORY:

Guru Ravidas Ayurved University Punjab, Hoshiarpur was created with the promulgation of the Guru Ravidas Ayurved University Punjab Act, 2009 (Punjab Act No. 4 of 2010) by the Punjab Legislative Assembly. The University started functioning w.e.f. 01.02.2011 in rented building of Panchayat Bhawan, Hoshiarpur. The main campus of the University is located in the foothills of Himalayas on Hoshiarpur-Una Road in 33 Acre of Land in village Kharkan (10 KM from Hoshiarpur city). The University has its own well constructed Administrative Block in approximately 5 Acre of land. This University regulates the conduct of undergraduate, post-graduate Ayurvedic, Homoeopathic, Unani and Ph.D teachings.

UNIVERSITY'S PRESENT STATUS:

This University is one of its own kinds in North India. At present the University has total 21 affiliated colleges viz 18 Ayurvedic, 2 Homoeopathy college and 1 Unani College. The P.G training in 2 M.D Ayurvedic Colleges in various departments are being imparted under the affiliation of this University. The University has started Ph.D. in four departments of Ayurveda from the year 2020. It has about 6,000 registered students presently undergoing undergraduate, Postgraduate and Ph.D. studies.

In addition to the academic activities, the University has also been providing health care services through its AYUSH OPD to the people of nearby villages.

The University has been striving to bring about major development in AYUSH and all basic, clinical and allied departments to pursue on education and research. Meritorious AYUSH faculties from all over the country are getting aspired to work in this University.

**IMPORTANT GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS
(PLEASE READ IN DETAIL)**

- 1.Registration for admission to BAMS/BHMS courses is to be undertaken online at the University website.
- 2.Application form for admission to BAMS/BHMS courses cannot be submitted offline/printed copy by post.
- 3.This prospectus contains two parts :
 - Part-A** Pertains to the general procedure for applying to admission, submission of admission application/counselling form, deposition of fee, important instructions, joining, etc.
 - Part-B** Pertains to Punjab Govt. Notifications/ NCISM, New Delhi/NCH, New Delhi for admission to BAMS/BHMS Courses proforma for different categories, self undertaking, etc.
- 4.Candidates must follow the instructions strictly as given in the Prospectus and University website. The applications of the candidates shall be summarily rejected, who will not comply with the instructions.
5. Incomplete application not in accordance with instructions shall not be considered and are liable to be rejected. The fee once deposited shall not be refunded under any circumstances.
- 6.This prospectus is subject to alteration(s) / modification(s) at any time without notice. For updates please visit University website from time to time.
7. Instructions in this prospectus are liable to changes based on decision/s taken by the Punjab Government/University from time to time. There is no equity or any rights that are/or deemed to be arising in favour of candidate.
8. Admissions including Eligibility to BAMS/BHMS Courses shall be governed and regulated as per the rules and regulations etc, as per Punjab Govt. notifications.
9. The candidate should read the eligibility condition carefully and just applying for admission/counselling does not entitle him/her for admission. Eligibility conditions for admissions are given in the Notification. The eligibility shall be determined by the Selection Committee/Principal of concerned college at the time of counselling/admission. Those who are not eligible as per Punjab Govt. notification will not be considered for admission. The candidates will participate in counselling process at their own risk & responsibility. Eligibility is also subject to medical fitness and such criteria as may be prescribed by the Punjab Government/ University/Medical institutions/ NCISM/NCH
10. Candidates' eligibility is purely provisional & subject to the fulfillment of eligibility criteria as Punjab Government Notification incorporated in this prospectus.
11. Applications of candidates producing false or fabricated documents/information shall not be considered and candidates shall be further debarred from participating in any Counselling's conducted by GRAU, Hoshiarpur.
12. Any attempt by a candidate to influence directly or indirectly any person concerned with the admission will disqualify him/her.
13. Final seat matrix shall be available on the University website at the time of filling options/preferences College/Quota/Category for online counselling.
14. The admission for BAMS/BHMS courses shall be made only to those institutions which have permission from all of the concerned authorities and affiliated with the University.
15. The fee structure for the Government/Private managed colleges is as per Punjab Government notification(s) for BAMS/BHMS courses. If Punjab Government issues any subsequent amendment/corrigendum for change in fee structure, the same will be applicable in letter and spirit.
16. In case of any discrepancy or contradiction between the Government notification/s and the University instructions contained in this Prospectus, the letter and spirit of the

notification/s shall be prevailing, however in academic matters the University shall be the final Authority.

17. Deposition of fee does not confirm the admission of the candidate, if it is challenged in the Hon'ble Court.
18. Changes, if any, in the Schedule / Counselling etc. shall be notified only through website of the University i.e. www.graupunjab.org
19. Candidates must retain the copy of prospectus with them till admissions. They should read carefully the instructions and the rules & regulations of the Punjab Govt. Notification/s and comply with all instructions therein strictly.
20. The allotment of College to the applicants for admission, shall be made as per merit determined on the basis of NEET-UG-2026 and the choice of the station opted by the candidate at the time of online counselling.
21. This is for the information of all candidates that as per Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the institution.
22. All the candidate must have read the Punjab Govt. notification/instructions as contained in the Prospectus carefully on University website www.graupunjab.org before filling online admission application form.
23. Candidates will fill only online admission application form through GRAU website i.e. www.graupunjab.org. Candidates are advised to fill online admission application form before the due date. Online Admission application form will not be available on University website after the due date/time. Candidates are advised to fill the online admission application form well in advance to avoid the network congestion in the last days. GRAUH will not be responsible for network congestion/problems. No request for accepting the forms after cut-off date will be entertained.
24. State Merit list will be prepared for different categories in which candidate applies, on the basis of NEET(UG)-2026 ranking.
25. **Post Matric Scholarship Scheme:** Scheduled Caste/Backward Classes category candidates shall be eligible to apply for the Post–Matric Scholarship and reimbursement of fee if they fulfill the terms and conditions laid down by Department of Welfare, Govt. of Punjab. For details regarding this scheme/forms/procedure, respective colleges/candidates should visit the website of Punjab Govt., Deptt. of Medical Education and Research (www.punjabmedicaleducation.org). For any query/clarification, candidates/respective colleges can contact the office of Director, Medical Education and Research, Punjab, Chandigarh or Director, Welfare Deptt., Punjab, Chandigarh. For further information and applying for scholarship candidates may visit <http://www.punjabscholarships.gov.in>. It is also the responsibility of the concerned candidate to ensure that college has filled his/her application for scholarship in time.
26. **Application Fee**
 - a) Admission Application Fee of Rs. 4600 (Rs.3750 for SC candidates) will only be deposited through Debit card/Credit Card/Netbanking after successful filling of online admission application form on University website.
 - b) Admission Application Fee will not be accepted in any form after due date/time in any case.
 - c) Only those Admission Application Forms will be considered for counselling, fee of which has been deposited by due date/time.
 - d) No request for accepting the Admission Application Forms after due date/time will be entertained.
 - e) Merely deposition of fee will not entitle the candidate for claim of admission.

- f) Fee once deposited in University Account will not be refunded/adjusted in any case.
27. Notwithstanding the participation of candidates in counselling, only eligible candidates, as per Government notification/s, shall be considered for admission.
28. Candidates applying under any of the reserved category are directed to fill the right category code mentioned in this prospectus for claiming reservation under a category and also bring/upload all relevant documents/proof of respective category with admission application form and also directed to bring along photocopies and original documents at the time of counselling/admission.
29. **Instructions only for NRI Candidates:-** Candidates who want to apply under NRI quota seats, have to obtain provisional Eligibility/Equivalency Certificate from the GRAU, Hoshiarpur.
30. **Annexure –I (Page no-84), Annexure-VI (Page no-107) & Annexure-VII (Page No-108) is compulsory for all the candidates applying for admission.**

- (i) "BAMS" means Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery.
- (ii) "BHMS" means Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery.
- (iii) "GRAUP" means Guru Ravidas Ayurved University Punjab, V.P.O Kharkan, Hoshiarpur.
- (iv) "Council" means the national statutory council regulating a particular discipline such as:-
- 'CCIM' means Central Council of Indian Medicine.
 - 'CCH' means Central Council of Homoeopathy.
 - 'NCISM' means National Commission for Indian System of Medicine
 - 'NCH' means National Commission for Homoeopathy
- (v) "Eligible Candidate" means a candidate who satisfies the requirements of eligibility as prescribed in the Prospectus / Government Notification **and corrigendum issued from time to time and other notifications issued for this purpose from time to time** and the criteria of Guru Ravidas Ayurved University Punjab, Hoshiarpur.
- (vi) "Government Notification" means Notification **No. No.5/3/2011-5HBIII/3042** dated:09.11.2022 **and corrigendum issued from time to time and other notifications issued for this purpose from time to time** by the Department of Medical Education & Research.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

1. The **admission to BAMS/BHMS Courses** shall be open to candidates who have qualified NEET UG-2026 and are eligible as per Punjab Govt. notifications and subsequent amendment(s)/corrigendum(s).
2. Merely applying for admission to **BAMS/BHMS** courses on the basis of NEET-UG-2026 will not entitle the Candidates eligible, eligibility and Merit of a candidate for admission will be determined by the **Selection Committee** strictly as per rules and regulations laid down in the **Punjab Govt. Notification(s)** as published in this prospectus and all other such documents as are required with the **ADMISSION APPLICATION FORM**.
3. Counselling/Admissions shall be conducted by the **Admission/Selection Committee** constituted by the Punjab Government for this purpose.
4. Age as per NEET-UG 2026.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING UP ONLINE ADMISSION APPLICATION FORM

1. Candidates will have to log on University website i.e. www.graupunjab.org and read the Punjab Govt. notifications and instructions as contained in the Prospectus carefully.
2. NEET-UG-2026 qualified candidates are eligible to apply **ONLINE** for admission to BAMS/BHMS Courses.
3. Candidates are required to register themselves for admission to BAMS/BHMS Courses through online registration system at GRAU website i.e. www.graupunjab.org. Online registration must be completed by due date and time.
4. Candidates are advised to fill the online admission application form well in advance to avoid the network congestion in the last days. GRAU will not be responsible for network congestion/problems. No request for accepting the forms after cut-off date will be entertained.
5. Following documents are required to upload on the online registration form:
 - I. Soft copy of Photograph of the candidate. (Maximum size 30 KB)
 - II. Soft copy of the signatures of the candidate. (Maximum Size 30 KB)
6. Specifications for Photograph:—
 - I. A coloured photograph of minimum 35x45 mm with at least 75% coverage of face & head of the candidate.
 - II. A caption indicating name of candidate and date of taking photograph should be there at the bottom of photo.
 - III. Photograph should be taken in a white /very light colored background.
 - IV. Photograph should not have cap or goggles. Spectacles are allowed if being used regularly. POLAROID and COMPUTER generated photos are not acceptable.
 - V. The photograph needs to display full front view of the face. Please look directly into the camera with a neutral expression.
 - VI. Please avoid photograph with reflection or shadow on the face with red eyes.
 - VII. The photograph needs to be printed on a high quality paper with at least 600 dpi resolutions.
 - VIII. The colours must possess the natural appearance and skin tone.
 - IX. The photograph must not have kinks, scratches and stains.

Note: Applications not complying with these instructions or with unclear photographs are liable to be rejected.
7. After completion of filling online admission application form, University will issue a unique Registration ID (i.e. Login ID) and password will be provided to the candidate at his/her registered Mobile number in admission application form through SMS/ email. Registration Number and password are mandatory for further process, so keep it secret and don't disclose to any unknown person.
8. Merely submission of online application form & fee does not confer any automatic rights to secure a BAMS/BHMS seat.
9. Please visit GRAU, Hoshiarpur website www.graupunjab.org for all regular and updated information concerning admissions/Date of counselling from time to time.
10. No request for submitting online application after due date/time will be entertained on any ground.
11. Candidate shall fill online ADMISSION APPLICATION FORM only once. Applications submitted more than once are liable to be rejected.
12. Candidates are required to fill online admission application form very carefully and should not leave any column blank, fill '0' (zero) in case of Roll Number/Rank/Marks are not available.
13. **Depositing Fee:** - After filling of successful online admission application form, Candidates will have to deposit the fee through payment gateway using Debit Card/Credit card/Net Banking .
14. Take printout of the online filled admission application form.
15. **Fill category(ies) carefully in the online admission application form. Category(ies) once claimed will not be changed in any case after submitting the form.**

Those candidates, who will not fill/claim any category code as per prospectus or wrongly filled category code other than mentioned in prospectus, will be treated as Open/General Category candidate. The candidate may select a category code from the codes on page No 14 and fill the category accordingly. More than one category may be filled by a candidate if it is considered applicable in the candidate's particular case. Category codes are exclusively for the purpose of facilitating the candidates to know and understand his/her respective merit placement at the time of counselling in various reserved categories as might have been filled by him/her. Reserved category selection on the part of the candidate shall not in any case be construed to give him/her any legitimacy or right or claim on the benefits for reserved seats during admission. Claims to admissions against reserved seats in BAMS/BHMS courses will be on the basis of appropriate claims made in the Admission Application Form subject to rules and regulations contained in the Punjab Government Notifications printed in the Part-B of this prospectus and as per the decisions of the Selection Committee constituted for this purpose by the Punjab Government. No benefit of reservation whatsoever shall be given if the claim is not made in Admission Application Form.

STEPS FOR ONLINE COUNSELLING :-

1. NEET-2026 qualified candidates shall visit University website i.e. www.graupunjab.org and fill the online registration form carefully within stipulated date & time. After successful registration of the applicant, a unique Registration ID (i.e. Login ID) and password will be allotted to the candidate at his/her registered Mobile No. or email through SMS or by email. Registration ID and password are mandatory for further process, so keep it secret and don't disclose to any unknown person.
2. Registration Fee for State Quota Candidates is Rs. 4,600/- (Rs. 3750/- for SC candidates) and for All India Quota candidates is Rs. 2,000/-
3. The candidate has to deposit the requisite fee through Payment Gateway using Debit Card/Credit Card/Net Banking.
4. **Only registered candidates are eligible for the counselling(s) and without registration, none of candidates are allowed for the counselling (online/physical).**
5. In the online application form candidate shall carefully fill the particulars viz; Name/Father Name/Preference of course / College/Category/Quota/NEET-2026 Marks, etc.
6. Candidates can fill their institutional preferences for getting their seats in the 1st round of counselling.
7. The seat will be allotted to the candidate as per merit list and institutional preferences filled by him/her in the online application form. The candidate has to report to his/her respective college for checking of eligibility, document verification and medical checkup. The candidates are required to produce his/her original documents/credentials for verification.
8. After the verification of the documents and checking of eligibility, candidate will deposit fee in the shape of demand draft of nationalized bank in the favour of Registrar, Guru Ravidas Ayurved University payable at Hoshiarpur.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ONLINE COUNSELLING

1. Online counselling will be conducted through University Website and online counselling form will be made available on University website as per dates specified in Important Dates column.
 2. In case of physical counselling, personal appearance of candidates is essential at the time of interview/counselling and exemptions from personal appearance may not be sought as it shall not be granted.
 3. The candidates should read the eligibility conditions carefully and just exercising online option of college/ appearing in counselling does not entitle him/her for admission.
 4. Eligibility conditions for admissions are as per Punjab Govt. Notification(s). The eligibility shall be determined by the Admission Committee at the time of counselling. Those who are not eligible as per Punjab Govt. notification will not be considered for admission. The candidates will appear in counselling at their own risk & responsibility.
 5. The allotment of seat and college shall be made as per the choice of the candidate at the time of the counselling by the Admission Committee on the basis of the merit determined as per marks obtained by the candidate in NEET-UG-2026 and other terms and conditions contained in the Punjab Government Notification for admission to BAMS/BHMS Courses.
 6. The candidates shall have to produce all the certificates/degrees/diplomas/ documents in original at the time of joining/admission in respective colleges or at the time of physical counselling.
 7. The choice(s) of courses/ institutions shall be exercised by the candidate at the time of Counselling/ interview.
 8. **Checking/Verification of Original Certificate/Documents** :Allocation of seat is provisional subject to verification of original documents/checking of eligibility by the Principal of concerned Ayurvedic/Homoeopathy Colleges. After provisional allocation of seat, candidate shall have to report to the allocated college for getting challan form, verification of documents and checking of eligibility. It is the sole responsibility of the Principal to authenticate the eligibility of the provisionally allocated candidate before their joining/admission.
 9. **Deposition of Annual Fee after provisional allocation** : Candidate will deposit tuition fee (as per Punjab Govt. notification) in the form of Demand Draft in favour of Registrar, Guru Ravidas Ayurved University, payable at Hoshiarpur . Candidate will report for medical checkup and joining after submission of proof of fee deposition to the respective college within stipulated time period, failing which allocated seat will stand cancelled automatically without any intimation to the candidate.
In case of physical counselling candidate will have to deposit tuition fee as specified in the Punjab Govt. notification on the spot at the venue of counselling in the shape of Demand Draft in favour of "Registrar, Guru Ravidas Ayurved University " payable at "Hoshiarpur" failing which his/her provisional selection will be treated as cancelled without any intimation to the candidate.

PROCEDURE OF ONLINE COUNSELLING AND JOINING AT THE COLLEGES

All the counselling for admission to BAMS/BHMS course NEET-UG-2026 will be conducted through online mode unless and until permitted by Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India and thereafter Physical counselling will be conducted. During online counselling, candidates will fill online counselling form therein they will opt for their preferences of course, college, category, quota. Seat will be allocated as per the merit of NEET UG – 2026 in order of preferences given by the candidate. Therefore, candidates are advised to take care during filling up the order of preferences of course, college, category, quota. Candidates of reserved categories will also be considered in open merit, if open merit seat is available then seat of open merit will be allocated to them else seat of reserved category will be allocated.

After provisionally allocation of seat, candidates can download provisional allocation letter from the University website after login to their account and report to the respective college along with all original documents for the checking of documents and their eligibility. **After checking of their original documents and eligibility, candidate will deposit fee in the shape of demand draft of nationalized bank in the name of Registrar Guru Ravidas Ayurved University payable at Hoshiarpur.** After depositing tuition fee, candidates will again report at the provisionally allocated college for their joining and medical checkup. If any candidate does not follow the said process his/her allocated seat will be cancelled automatically without any intimation.

If candidate is satisfied with seat allocated to him/her during online counselling, he/she is not required to participate in the subsequent round of counsellings. **In case, candidate wants to upgrade/change his/her seat he/she will have to participate in the subsequent round of counselling and give his/her preferences afresh for the course/college/category/quota.**

In case any candidate wants to quit the course/seat, he/she will have to submit application to the respective college for surrender of seat well in advance before start of next round of counselling.

In case the seat of a candidate is upgraded/changed in the subsequent round of counselling and he/she has already deposited the tuition fee, he/she is not required to deposit fee again, provided he/she has to deposit difference in fee, if any.

1. The Government of Punjab is pleased to notify the admission criteria to Undergraduate Degree courses i.e. BAMS, BHMS and BUMS for the year 2022 onwards in the Government & Private Ayurvedic, Homoeopathic and Unani Institutes including Private/Deemed Universities in the State of Punjab.
2. All admissions to Govt. Quota seats/Management Quota seats, including NRI and any other seats, whatsoever in the Government & Private Ayurvedic/Homoeopathic/Unani institutes, shall be based on the merit of National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA).
3. The Government of Punjab is further pleased to authorize Guru Ravidas Ayurved University Punjab, Hoshiarpur to conduct centralized counselling for admission to BAMS/BHMS/BUMS on the basis of marks obtained in NEET.
4. After the declaration of NEET result, the candidates shall apply on the specific Performa for all seats to Guru Ravidas Ayurved University Punjab, Hoshiarpur. Admission shall be made by the Admission Committee through a Centralized Counseling to be conducted by Guru Ravidas Ayurved University Punjab, Hoshiarpur on the basis of inter-se-merit of NEET. Fee and other charges for submission of application and counseling to be charged by the University shall be Rs. 3750/- for SC/ST candidates and Rs. 4600/- for all other candidates.
5. The Schedule of counseling, admission and start of classes shall be in conformity with the schedule laid down by Govt. of India, Ministry of AYUSH/State Govt./ National Commission for Indian System of Medicine/National Commission of Homeopathy and shall be notified on the website of Guru Ravidas Ayurved University Punjab, Hoshiarpur i.e. www.graupunjab.org.
6. The detail of the Institutions and category-wise seats matrix shall be available on the website of Guru Ravidas Ayurved University Punjab, Hoshiarpur before the commencement of the counselling process.
7. Out of total seats 85% will be for candidates from Punjab State, whereas the remaining 15% seats will be open for candidates from any other state/UT of India as per letter No.

BUSS/Admission counsel (UG)/2021-22 dated 14-10-2022 issued by NCISM, Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India which are as under :-

(i) Ayush Admissions Central Counseling Committee (AACCC), Ministry of Ayush will conduct "AIQ-UG & PG Online Counseling" for admission in Govt./ Govt. Aided Colleges/Institutes, Central/Deemed Universities and National Institutes of ASU&H streams.

(ii) Further, the State/UT Counseling authorities shall conduct counseling for seats under Private ASU&H admission in 15% of AIQ-UG&PG colleges/institutes/ Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities).

(iii) State/UT Counseling Authorities have to conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG&PG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities) in adherence with guidelines/schedule provided by the AACCC, Ministry of Ayush to avoid the overlapping of the Schedule of AACCC-UG/PG counseling and State/UT-UG/PG counseling.

8. A candidate from reserved Category shall have the right to compete for admission in General /Unreserved category seats as per his/her merit on the day of counselling and candidate so selected shall not be counted towards admission in the reserve category.
9. For seats under Punjab quota, the candidate should be a bonafide resident of Punjab. The resident status of Punjab state shall be taken in terms of Punjab Government, Department of Personnel and Administrative reforms (PP-II Branch) letter No. 1/3/95-3 PP II/9619, dated 6th June,1996, ID No.1/2/96-3PP-2/8976,dated 7th July,1998 and ID No.1/3/95-3PP/II/81, dated 1st January 1999 and any further instructions issued by the Department of Personnel, if any, and the same shall be adhered to. Candidate must have passed 10+1 and 10+2 examination from Punjab. Candidate who passed his/her 10+1 and 10+2 examinations or other equivalent examination from a recognized School/Institution situated in Chandigarh (Union Territory), who is bonafide resident of Punjab shall also be eligible.

The following categories shall be exempted from this condition:-

- i) Children/wards/dependents (whose parents are not alive) of all those regular Punjab Government employees, members of All India Services borne on Punjab cadre, Serving Judges and the employees of the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, employees of Boards/Corporations/Statutory Bodies established by an Act of the State of Punjab who have been holding posts outside Punjab on or before 1st January of the year of passing 10+2 examination and their children/wards/dependants have passed class XI and/or XII examinations from outside Punjab.

ii) Children/wards/dependents (whose parents are not alive) of all those regular Central Government employees, employees of Boards/Corporations/Statutory Bodies of the Central Government who have remained posted inside Punjab for at least two years out of the three years preceding year of passing 10+2 examination but were posted outside Punjab for some time during these three years due to which their children/wards/dependants have passed class XI and/or XII or equivalent qualifying examinations from outside Punjab. However those who remained posted in Punjab continuously for these three years shall not be entitled to be exempted as they are equally placed with other Punjab Government employees posted in Punjab.

iii) Children/wards/dependents (whose parents are not alive) of all those Punjab Government pensioners who have retired on or before 1st January of the year of passing 10+2 examination and have settled outside Punjab on or before 1st January of the year of passing 10+2 examination and their children/wards/dependants have passed class XII examination from outside Punjab.

iv) Children/wards/dependents (whose parents are not alive) of those military/para-military forces personnel who are born or belong to the State of Punjab as per their service record at the time of entry into service.

v) Children/wards/dependents (whose parents are not alive) of those Ex-employees of military/ Para military forces who are born or belong to State of Punjab as per their service record at the time of entry into the service and have retired on or after 1st January of the year preceding two years of the year of passing 10+2 examination.

vi) Candidates belonging to minority community who are competing for the minority quota in the minority institutions.

vii) Candidates seeking admission under NRI category.

viii) Wards of defence personnel posted in Punjab.

Provided however, that in case adequate numbers of candidates from Punjab are not available for BAMS/BHMS/BUMS course, then other States candidates may be considered for admission in Punjab quota, strictly as per NEET merit.

In view of the judgment dated 02.07.2014 in CWP No. 6009 of 2014 and connected cases by the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, the eligibility criteria from academic session 2019-2020 onwards shall be, inter-alia as under:-

"The candidate shall have passed his/her 10th Class examination and also 10+1 and 10+2 from the State of Punjab."

(x) **Economically Weaker Section (EWS):-** Ten percent seats at Govt. Ayurvedic College Patiala shall be reserved for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) as per Govt. of India, Ministry of AYUSH, New Delhi File No. L-14011/5/019 (EP-1) dated 24.06.2019.

Category I: NRI/Children of NRI who originally belong to the State of Punjab.

Category II: NRI/Children of NRI who originally belong to an Indian State other than Punjab

I). Under this policy Non-Resident Indian means a person of Indian origin, whether holding an Indian Passport or Foreign Passport, who is either permanently or temporarily settled outside India and in either case:

- (i) for or on taking up employment outside India ; or
- (ii) for carrying on a business or vocation outside India; or
- (iii) for any other purpose, in such circumstances, as would indicate his intention to stay outside India for an uncertain period;

For ascertaining the eligibility relevant documents including Foreign Country Passport or Green Card or Permanent Resident Card or Proof of Residency of Foreign country issued by competent authority or OCI/PIO Card issued by the Government of India shall be taken into consideration.

- II). The eligibility of the candidates shall be determined by the Guru Ravidas Ayurved University, Hoshiarpur who shall issue an eligibility certificate to each such candidate.
- III). The NRI students shall have to give a bank guarantee/surety bond for the balance of fee, if they opt to pay the fee in installments as provided.
- IV). The Centralized Counselling of NRI quota seats shall be held before the Counselling for other categories. In case of any seat remaining vacant under NRI quota, during / after 2nd Centralized Counselling of NRI quota in State Colleges, it shall go to General Category and in the Private colleges shall go to General Category of Management quota. The NRI left over seats shall be filled by the same Admission Committee from amongst the eligible candidates of NEET.

13. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO BAMS/BHMS/BUMS COURSES;

No candidate shall be admitted to BAMS, BUMS & BHMS Degree Courses unless he/she has attained the age of seventeen years on or before the 31st December of the year of his/her admission in the first year of the course. Further, there is no upper age limit for admission to BAMS/BHMS/BUMS -UG courses as per NCISM.

I). FOR BAMS

- a) The candidate must have passed intermediate (10+2) or its equivalent examination recognized by the concerned State Government and Education Board with the subject of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English individually and must have obtained minimum of fifty percent marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology at the aforesaid qualifying examination in the case of General Category and forty percent marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.
- b). In respect of person with Disability candidate specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in the said qualifying examination in Physics, Chemistry and Biology shall be forty five percent in the case of General Category and forty percent marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

II) FOR BHMS

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- a). The candidate must have passed intermediate (10+2) or its equivalent examination recognized by the concerned State Government and Education Board with the subject of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English individually and must have obtained minimum of fifty percent marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology at the aforesaid qualifying examination in the case of General Category and forty percent marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.
 - b). Candidate with Bench marks Disability as specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in the said qualifying examination in Physics, Chemistry and Biology shall be forty five percent for General Category, forty percent marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

III). FOR BUMS

Eligibility for admission to Kamil E-Tib-Wa-Jarahat course: To seek admission in respective course of Bachelor of Unani Medicine are as under :-

(i) **Admission to Kamil-E-Tib.O -Jarajat Course:-** A candidate seeking admission to main Kamil-E-Tib.O -Jarajat (Bachelor of Unani Medicine and Surgery-BUMS) course must have passed,-

(a). The candidate must have passed intermediate (10+2) or its equivalent examination recognized by the concerned State Government and Education Board with the subject of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English individually and must have obtained minimum of fifty percent marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology at the aforesaid qualifying examination in the case of General Category and forty percent marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

b). In respect of person with Disability candidate specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in the said qualifying examination in Physics, Chemistry and Biology shall be forty five percent in the case of General Category and forty percent marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

c) Provided that the NEET shall not be applicable to Pre-Tib candidates and ten percent seats shall be reserved for Pre-Tib candidates.

14. PROCEDURE FOR FILLING LEFT OVER SEATS:-

For all the left over seats the counselling shall be held at University level, by the same Admission Committee with the same merit as that of NEET. No fresh applications shall be called and no admission shall be done by individual institutions under any circumstances.

15. APPELLATE AUTHORITY:-

Director, Research and Medical Education, Punjab, shall be the appellate authority in case of any dispute.

20. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- i) The University shall display combined merit list of all candidates including reserve category and also a separate merit list of different categories which should be displayed on the University website at least 3 days before the counselling.
- ii) The admission shall be made to only those institutes which are approved from all the concerned authorities on or before the first counselling. Institute(s) which has applied for affiliation and/or for approval of competent authority(ies) but are unable to get affiliation and such approval from all the concerned authorities before this day shall not be considered for counselling. However these institutes may be included in subsequent counseling.
- iii) The last cut off date for admission to BAMS/BHMS/BUMS as per notification of Govt. of India/Ministry of Ayush.
- iv) In case of candidates whose parents are not alive, the dependency certificate shall have to be taken from the Deputy Commissioner / District Collector of the District or any other Government official duly authorized by the State Government or Deputy Commissioner / District Collector where the candidate resides.
- v) Students claiming benefits of reservation under SC/BC category shall be required to produce a certificate from the competent authority as per latest instructions of Govt. of Punjab. Further, a valid Backward Class Certificate must be produced as per the latest instructions of Department of Welfare, Government of Punjab in which the annual income of the family is clearly mentioned.
- vi) Scheduled Caste/ Backward Classes category candidates shall be eligible to apply for Post-Matric Scholarship and reimbursement of fee if they fulfill the terms and conditions laid down by Department of Welfare, Govt. of Punjab.
- vii) The Reservation of Physically Challenged persons shall be as per the provision of Right of Persons with Disability Act 2016.
- viii) Seats remaining vacant under any of the reserve / minority category shall be transferred to the General Category.
- ix) For students admitted through online counseling, fee shall be deposited as prescribed by Guru Ravidas Ayurved University, Hoshiarpur after verification of documents. For students admitted through physical counseling, fee shall be deposited through Bank Demand Draft only.

21. The State Government reserves the right to amend any clause and procedure for admission.

22. In case of any doubt, the Administrative Secretary, Department of Medical Education & Research, Government of Punjab may issue clarification which will have force of the policy.
23. This notification supersedes all the notifications for admission to BAMS/BHMS/BUMS courses in the State, issued earlier.

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to hereby forward the Instructions on Counseling in All India Quota (AIQ), State/UT Quota seats of Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani (ASU) UG (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS) and PG (MD/MS) courses for the academic year 2026-27 (Annexure-I) and Directives for Implementing Central/State/UT Counseling for Admission in Undergraduate (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) courses of Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani & Homoeopathy (ASU&H) streams for the Academic Session 2025-2026 (Annexure-II).
2. Further, all Counseling authorities (Central/State/UT), Universities and ASU medical colleges/institutes are hereby informed to strictly adhere to and comply with the above-mentioned instructions and directives for implementing Central/State/UT counseling and admission process for Undergraduate (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) courses of Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani & Homoeopathy (ASU&H) streams to be held for the academic session 2026-2027.

**Directives for Counseling & Admission in Undergraduate
(BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) Courses of Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani &
Homoeopathy (ASU&H) Streams for the Academic Session 2026-27**

A. DIRECTIVES FOR COUNSELING AUTHORITIES (STATE /UT)

I. Common directives for State/UT Counseling and Admissions:

Eligibility Criteria to Participate in the Counseling:

1. Colleges/Institute who have received permission from the Medical Assessment and Rating Board/National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) for Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani streams or the Medical Assessment and Rating Board/National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH) for admission to ASU&H- UG courses for the academic session 2026-27 shall only be eligible to participate in the counseling process.

Seat Matrix (AIQ & State / UT Quota):

2. The seat matrix for admission in the State/UT Government/Government-aided institutions and Private Institutions shall be fifteen per cent (15%) for All-India Quota and eighty-five per cent (85%) for State/Union Territory Quota as specified in the NCISM and NCH Regulations in force at the time of admission. (Please refer to SI.No:14 of this guideline).

Provided that-

- i. the AIQ for the purpose of admission in all the Deemed Universities (both Government and Private - established under Central Act), shall be hundred per cent;
 - ii. the University and institute, which are already having more than fifteen per cent All-India Quota seats, shall continue to maintain that quota;
 - iii. Five per cent. of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government and Government-aided institutions shall be filled up by candidate with specified disability in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) and based on the merit list of NEET(UG)-2026.
3. For State/UT quota (85%), the seat matrix for Government, Management, NRI quota etc., shall be as per respective State/UT policy; however, all admissions (except foreign nationals) shall be through counseling conducted by State/UT counseling authority.
 4. The Management seats under the State/UT Quota in Private Institutions shall be treated as domicile-free.

Reservation:

5. Category-wise reservation of seats shall be as per Central or State or UT Reservation Policy, as the case may be.
6. Reservation for allotment of 15% AIQ-UG seats in Private ASU&H Institutes:-All AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes are open in nature (all category candidates are eligible).

However, as mentioned in relevant regulations, the relaxation in qualifying criteria may be provided category-wise.

Counseling schedule:

7.State/UT counseling authorities shall follow the counseling schedule for the A.Y. 2026-27 as specified by NCISM/NCH for seamless admission process as given below:

Date of course commencement of the BAMS/BUMS/BSMS/BHMS: 2nd November, 2026

As per National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (National Examinations for Indian System of Medicine) Regulations, 2023 and National Commission for Homoeopathy Examination Regulations 2023.

*A penalty of ₹1,00,000 (Rupees One Lakh) per day shall be levied by the NCISM/NCH on colleges/institutes for failure to submit the admission data within 30th November, 2026 (On or Before 6 PM).

- ❖ It has been observed in past academic year that the schedule of State/UT Ayush Counseling is delayed as a result of which candidate find difficulties in making choice of college for admission/ becoming ineligible for Ayush Counseling/forfeiture of Security money thus inviting multiple grievances and litigations. In order to avoid it State/UT-Counseling authority/University need to begin their State/UT Ayush Counseling as per schedule specified.
- ❖ State/UT Ayush Counseling authority shall provide the data of vacant seat on the last day of reporting of every round to Central Govt. (AACCC, NCISM) to take analytical/calculative decision regarding counseling.

Counseling and Admissions:

8. All sanctioned/permitted seats by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (MARBISM)/NCISM/Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy (MARBH)/NCH, irrespective of categories/reservations, are to be filled only through online counseling, i.e., Central/State/UT counseling as the case may be (except foreign nationals).
9. Ayush Admissions Central Counseling Committee (AACCC), NCISM will conduct "AIQ-UG Online Counseling" for admission to AIQ (15%) seats under State Govt. /Govt. Aided Colleges/Institutes, Central/Deemed Universities (Established under Central Act) and National Institutes of ASU&H streams.
10. The State/UT Counseling authorities shall conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act). Further, State/UT Counseling shall be conducted in adherence to guidelines/schedule provided by NCISM/NCH to avoid the overlapping of the Schedule of AACCC counseling and State/UT counseling.
11. For State/UT Quota (85%), the seat matrix for Government, Management, NRI Quota etc., shall be as per respective State and UT policy; however, all admissions in all quotas (except foreign nationals) shall be through online counseling conducted by State/UT counseling authority.
12. Seat allotment in any category shall be as per inter-se-merit.
13. No candidate who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks in NEET (UG)-2026 shall be eligible for admission to Undergraduate courses for the academic year 2026-27.
14. Qualification Criterion:(As per the ASU &H-UG Regulations in force at the time of admission)
 - (a) National Commission for Indian System of Medicine(Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022
 - (b) National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Unani Education) Regulations-2022
 - (c) National Commission for Indian System of Medicine(Minimum Standards of

- Undergraduate Siddha Education) Regulations-2022*
- (d) National Commission for Homeopathy (Homeopathy Graduate Degree Course- Bachelor Homeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S) Regulations-2022*
 - (e) The National Commission for Homoeopathy (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course – Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S.) Amendment Regulations 2025*
 - (f) NCISM's BOA letter dated 19.08.2026*
 - (g) NCISM's BUSS (Unani-U.G.Reg.) letter dated*
 - (h) NCISM's BUSS (SID-UG-MSE) letter dated*

For admission to ASU & H-UG Courses:

15. The eligibility to admission in ASU&H-UG courses should be as per the ASU&H-UG regulations and should be followed strictly. The details of qualifications for different categories are as follows:

- For ASU&H- UG Courses - the candidate shall have passed 10 +2 (or equivalent) with subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Biotechnology

16. No candidate shall be admitted to BAMS, BSMS, BUMS & BHMS Degree Courses unless he/she has attained the age of seventeen years on or before the 31st December of the year of his/her admission in the first year of the course. Further, there is no upper age limit for admission to ASU&H-UG courses.

17. In order to be eligible for admission to an undergraduate course for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at the 50th percentile in the 'National Eligibility cum Entrance Test' for the undergraduate course' held for the said academic year:

Provided that in respect of -

- (a) candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at the 40th percentile;
- (b) candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile in the case of the General category and 40th percentile in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

18. No Authority or Institution shall admit any candidate to the Undergraduate courses in contravention of the criteria or procedure laid down in respect of admissions, and any admissions made in contravention shall be cancelled by the NCISM/NCH.

19. Any admissions made beyond/over and above the intake capacity sanctioned/permitted by MARBISM/NCISM/MARBH/NCH for the said academic session shall not be approved.

20. Vide Court order dated 30.11.2023 in SCA No. 19485/2023 at High Court of Gujarat, the Court has observed that the authority has not provided any guidelines to fill the seats that remain vacant after the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR). To comply with the direction of the court, it is requested to all Central/State/UT counseling Authorities to conduct sufficient phase- wise allotments in stray vacancy round to fill the seats, considering the number of available candidates in the Central/State/UT merit list, whichever is applicable, and availability of vacant seats till the seats get filled within the cut-off date of admission as notified by the NCISM/NCH. The guidelines for State/UT counseling Authorities to conduct the SVR are as follows:

- a) Publication of non-reported /not-filled seats after R-3 on the State/UT counseling portal (wide publicity by any other means may also be adopted)
- b) Publication of ineligible list of candidates who have not complied with the

Central/State/UT counseling rules/norms

- c) Registration facility for non-registered candidates on the State/UT counseling portal
 - d) Choice filling facility, as applicable.
 - e) Allotment of seats is based on the merit and preferences of the candidates.
 - f) Publication of result on the State/UT counseling portal
 - g) Reporting at the allotted institute
21. After the first phase of allotment in SVR, publish the non-reported/not-filled seats on the State/UT counseling portal and conduct subsequent rounds to fill the vacant seats, if any, as per the procedure mentioned in the first phase allotment considering the availability of candidates. Eligible non-registered candidates shall be provided the registration facility for all rounds of SVR; however, the whole process of SVR allotment be completed within the time frame, and no admission after the cut-off date decided by NCISM/NCH shall be allowed/approved. The schedule for the last round of SVR shall be conducted in such a way that the allotted candidates will get sufficient time to report to the allotted institute before the cut-off date of admission decided by NCISM/NCH.
22. It has been observed in past few years, that different Hon'ble Courts use to grant relief to the candidates taking offline admission just before cut-off date of admission on the ground of technical glitch in State/UT-Ayush Counseling portal. Therefore, State/UT-Ayush Counseling Authorities portal must be technically sound for seamless online counseling and admissions of eligible candidates, till the process of admissions last.
23. **There shall not be any institute-level counseling through any mode. Any admissions made at the institute level shall not be approved by the NCISM/NCH/Concerned University, and the institute shall be penalized as per the provision laid down under sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28 of the NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020.**
24. There shall not be any offline admission or admission without counseling (Central/State/UT), and any admissions in contravention of this shall not be approved.
25. Admission made in violation of the NCISM / NCH directives will be treated as invalid, and action will be initiated under the NCISM Act, 2020 / NCH Act, 2020.
26. Institutes will be held responsible in case students face hardship due to admission irregularities such as offline admissions, admission without counseling, and admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity. In such case, students shall be discharged from the course and institution, and the institute will be subjected to face consequences as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1) (a) (f) of section 28 of NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020, and the person responsible will be prosecuted as per the section of IPC/BNS concerned, whichever is applicable.
27. **Admissions shall not be approved by any means after the cut-off date and time for admission as specified by NCISM/NCH.**
28. No authority has the power to extend or modify the cut-off date of admission specified by NCISM/NCH, and such admissions shall not be approved.
29. No authority has the power to modify the intake capacity for admission into UG courses in ASU&H colleges sanctioned by MARBISM/NCISM/MARBH/NCH.
30. State/UT Counseling Authorities may direct ASU&H colleges/institutes to ensure the eligibility of the candidate as laid down in respective NCISM (MSE-UG) Regulations 2022 and NCISM letter ref NCISM's letter no. BOA/2-B/UG/2026,11-76/2021-BUSS(Unani-U.G. Regl.), NCISM's letter no.18-12/2021-BUSS(SID-UG-MSE) dated 20.08.2026 for Ayurveda, Siddha & Unani for admissions in ASU-UG courses and NCH (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course – Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S). Regulations- 2022 and The National Commission for Homoeopathy (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course – Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S.)

Amendment Regulations 2025 for admissions in Homoeopathy-UG courses by proper scrutiny of the relevant original certificates and documents at the time of admission.

31. AACCC will circulate the list of ineligible candidates to the State/UT counseling Authority during the 3rd & Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II) of AACCC-UG counseling to prevent them from participating in the State/UT counseling. **State/UT Counseling Authorities need to ensure that such candidates have not been allotted any seat through any rounds of State/UT counseling for admission in ASU&H-UG courses.**
32. State/UT Counseling Authorities may direct ASU&H colleges/institutes to ensure the authenticity and correctness of the details of admitted students before completing the admission procedures. Further, the ASU&H colleges/institutes should be instructed not to allow admissions without original documents. No modifications/ corrections after the cut-off date and time of admission as specified by NCISM/NCH shall be entertained.
33. The State/UT Counseling authorities have to submit a list of admitted students (i.e. college-wise consolidated list of admitted students through all rounds of counseling) to NCISM/NCH within specified date as mentioned in the schedule from the cut-off date of admission in the format and in the manner as prescribed by NCISM/NCH.
34. All State/UT Counseling Authorities are requested to see the website of AACCC (www.aaccc.gov.in), from time to time for AACCC-UG counseling scheme & FAQs, Schedule, and any updates/notices uploaded regarding the All India Quota-ASU&H-UG counseling for the A.Y 2026-27.
35. The State/ UT counseling for ASU&H-UG Courses shall be started only after Central Counseling has commenced, in accordance with the schedule issued by NCISM/NCH.
36. In past few years, the student helpline center of AACCC, receive lot of grievances from candidates participating in State/UT-Ayush Counseling that is outside the purview of Central Ayush Counseling Authority. Therefore, State/UT Counseling Authority must run an effective Query Redressal System to facilitate the counseling and admission process of UG courses and provide the email ID & Phone no of the same on the State/UT Counseling Authority's website.
37. **State Ayush Admissions Reporting Portal:** All State/UT counseling Authorities are requested to upload the round-wise data on admissions made through State/UT counseling under 85% of State/UT Quota seats of State Govt./Govt. Aided colleges and 100% seats of Private Institutions of Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani and Homoeopathy streams all over the Country on the interphase of the AACCC-UG portal.

Determination of fees and other charges in case of ASU&H colleges/institutes under NCISM/NCH:

38. The fee for 50 percentage (50%) of total sanctioned/permitted seats in Private ASU&H medical colleges/institutes and deemed universities which are governed under the NCISM Act, 2020/NCH Act, 2020, is to be determined by Fee fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of the respective State/UT/Deemed University as per the guidelines for "Determination of fee and all other charges" prescribed by NCISM (BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16-09-2022), and NCH (F.No 1-11/2022/NCH/10322-10331 dated 23.11.2022) which has been implemented from the A.Y 2022-23 onwards.

Tuition fee:

39. All State/UT Counseling authorities are requested to ensure that the tuition fee, as laid down and fixed by respective governing or fee fixation committees as applicable, shall be charged in each academic session for four and half years only by the institutes. No tuition fee shall be charged for extended study duration in case of failing examinations or for any other reasons, and there shall not be any fee for internship training at the same institute.

40. All Central/State/UT Counseling authorities are requested to ensure that the college should display tuition fees, hostel fees, and other fees, if any, on the institute's website and the Institute profile while uploading to the Central/State/UT counseling Portal. The same is to be charged from the student at the time of admission. No other charges other than the displayed fees should be charged / collected.

II. Directives for State/UT counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act)

1. State/UT Counseling authorities shall conduct counseling for 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under Central Act).
2. State/UT Counseling Authorities have to conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/ State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under Central Act) in adherence with guidelines/schedule provided by NCISM/NCH to avoid the overlapping of the schedule of AACCC counseling and State or UT counseling.
3. State/UT counseling authorities should give wider publicity among NEET (UG)- 2026 qualified ASU&H-UG aspirants regarding the registration process of counseling & provide sufficient time for registration before each round of counseling for admission in AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU&H Institutes.
4. State/UT may decide on an all-inclusive application Cost/Non-refundable Registration Fee for counseling for admission in ASU&H-UG seats for all category students. However, the maximum ceiling limit for this fee will be Rs 2000/-.
5. State/UT may decide on refundable security money, which will be refunded to candidates after joining the allotted college or if the candidate does not get any seat during counseling. However, the maximum ceiling limit for this fee will be Rs. 50,000/- for UG seats.
6. Central Govt. receives multiple grievances on non-refund of Security money to eligible candidates of State/UT-Ayush Counseling. State/UT Ayush Counseling authorities need to refund the collected security amount to the eligible candidates in time bound manner after completion of Counseling.
7. State/UT counseling authorities shall conduct 3 rounds of counseling for admission in 15% of All India Quota (AIQ) UG seats of Private ASU&H Institutes/Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act). The AIQ seats that remain vacant after the Third round of State/UT counseling may be transferred and converted to the State/UT quota seats, and the same shall be filled up in further rounds as per State Government norms/ rules.
8. No domicile certificate is required for allotment of AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU &H Institutes.
9. For PwBD candidates, the PwBD certificate should be as per the guidelines issued vide NCISM letter ref 1/2/2026-AACCC dated 20.08.2026/NCH letter ref 1-2/2026-AACCC dated 20.08.2026 (Available on counseling website (www.aaccc.gov.in)).
10. **The admission on any other reserved quota seats in State shall be through Counseling authority designated by Central/State/UT Govt. only. Admissions done through any committee/local body/private organization members shall not be approved by NCISM/NCH.**

B. DIRECTIVES FOR UNIVERSITIES

1. In case of admission in Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani, and Homoeopathy courses, the University shall approve the admissions made by any college/institute with proper permission from the MARBISM/NCISM/MARBH/NCH for the academic session 2026-2026.
2. The University shall not approve the admissions made by the colleges/institutes under the following conditions:
 - Offline admissions
 - Admissions without counseling(Central/State/UT);
 - Admissions after the cut-off-date,
 - Admissions beyond sanctioned intake capacity.
 - Admissions without original mandatory documents
3. There shall not be any institute-level counseling through any mode. Any admissions made at the institute level shall not be approved by the NCISM/NCH/Concerned University and the institute shall be penalized as per the provision laid down under sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28 of the NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020.

C. DIRECTIVES FOR COLLEGES/INSTITUTES

1. No candidate who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks in NEET (UG)-2026 shall be admitted to ASU&H Undergraduate courses for the academic year 2026-27.

2. There shall not be any institute-level counseling through any mode. Any admissions made at the institute level shall not be approved by the NCISM/NCH/Concerned University. Any such admissions made in contravention to the directives/guidelines issued by the NCISM/NCH, the institute shall be penalized as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28 of NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020.

3. There shall not be any offline admission or admission without counseling (Central/State/UT), or admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity, and any admissions in contravention of this shall not be approved.

4. Admission made in violation of the NCISM/NCH directives will be treated as invalid, and action will be initiated under the NCISM Act, 2020/NCH Act, 2020.

5. Institutes will be held responsible in case students face hardship due to admission irregularities such as offline admissions, admission without counseling, and admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity etc. In such cases, students shall be discharged from the course and institution. The institute will be subjected to face consequences as per the provision laid down under sub-section (1) (a) (f) of section 28 of NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020. The persons responsible will be prosecuted as per the section of IPC/BNS concerned, whichever is applicable.

6. ASU&H colleges/institutes should ensure the candidate's eligibility as laid down in respective regulations as mentioned in these guidelines and proper scrutiny of the relevant original certificates and documents at the time of admission.

7. It is requested that all participating institutes must visit Central (AACCC-UG portal : www.aaccc.gov.in), and the concerned State/UT counseling portal from time to time for counseling scheme & FAQs, Schedule and any updates/notices regarding UG counseling 2026-27.

8. ASU&H colleges/institutes should ensure the authenticity and correctness of the details of admitted students before completing admission procedures. No modifications/ corrections after the cut-off date and time of admission as specified by NCISM/NCH shall be entertained.

9. The colleges should follow the Central/State/UT counseling schedule and upload the details of admitted students and non-reported/vacant seats, if any, for each round on the concerned counseling authority portal, even on holidays.

10. The list of all admitted students with all details shall be uploaded and submitted to NCISM/NCH in the format prescribed by NCISM/NCH **on or before 06:00 PM on the cut-off date** (30th November, 2026) for admission as specified by NCISM/NCH.

As per National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (National Examinations for Indian System of Medicine) Regulations, 2023 and National Commission for Homoeopathy Examination Regulations 2023.

11. The college shall display tuition fees, hostel fees, and other fees, if any, on the institute's website and on the Institute profile while uploading on the Central/State/UT counseling portal as applicable. The same is to be charged from the student at the time of admission. No other charges other than the displayed fees should be collected from the candidates.

Provided that in respect of persons with disability candidate specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in the said examinations shall be forty-five per cent. in the case of General category and forty per cent. in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.” stands modified as-

“The Candidates shall have passed 10+2 (or equivalent) with subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Biotechnology.” The admission shall continue to be done through National Eligibility cum- Entrance Test (NEET) only.

The venue for the Assessment Board in Delhi shall be Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi (Constitution of board enclosed as Annexure-II).

Further, the BOA and BUSS, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) decided to review Appendix A and B of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022 with the objective to align the guidelines with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 in its joint board meeting held on 19.08.2026

In this respect, both the boards unanimously agreed to adopt the "Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for Admission to the MBBS Course", 2026 issued on 27.07.2026 issued by NMC, for the admissions in ASU courses in AY 2026-27 (copy enclosed) to ensure parity and standardization across medical education systems

Accordingly, the NCISM has resolved that all candidates with benchmark disabilities, who possess a valid UDID card issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) and further meet the NEET UG eligibility criteria, shall be considered for admission in BAMS/BUMS/BSMS course under the PwBD category.

Further, it is informed that, the following documents must be mandatorily submitted by PwBD candidates at the time of reporting to designated disability centers of MCC for obtaining disability certificates for the academic year 2026-27:

- NEET UG 2026 result demonstrating eligibility for the BAMS/BUMS/BSMS course.
- Valid UDID card (Yellow or above) issued by the DEPwD (excluding visual disabilities)
- Self-certified affidavits in the prescribed format, specific to the candidate's disability category, as provided in Schedule-I (Copy enclosed)
- The candidate will have to approach the designated Medical Board for verification of **their self-certified affidavits**.

- Candidates who wish to claim All India Quota seat under PwBD category are required to visit one of the 62 designated disability centres of MCC (List enclosed) and submit following documents at the centre to obtain the Disability certificate
 - NEET UG 2026 result demonstrating eligibility for the BAMS/BUMS/BSMS course.
 - Valid UDID card (Yellow or above) issued by the DEPwD (excluding visual disabilities)
 - Self-certification form in the prescribed format of NCISM as provided in Appendix-A (Copy enclosed)
 - Affidavits, specific to the candidate's disability category, in the prescribed format of NCISM as provided in Appendix-A to F (Copy enclosed)
- The certificate will be generated by the center as per details of disability mentioned on the UDID card, affidavit submitted by the PwBD candidate, fulfillment of eligibility criteria subject to Board assessment of functional competencies.
- For disabilities other than the one already discussed in respect of Locomotor, Hearing, Visual and SLD/ASD/ Mental Illness, they will have to submit a valid UDID card and the self-certified affidavit prescribed in Appendix-A under the category "Others".
- Only those candidates who have obtained Disability certificate from a designated center of MCC will be shown choices of PwBD seats for All India Quota.
- The disability certificate will be valid for this academic session only.
- Candidates who wish to avail PwBD seat under 85% State quota can visit state disability boards for obtaining certificates. However, evaluation has to be conducted by the state disability boards as per NCISM Guidelines (2026)

Subject: Addendum regarding the applicability of the Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for admission to Undergraduate ASU Courses, 2026-27

1. Attention is invited to the provisions relating to admission of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) to the BAMS/BUMS/BSMS Courses, 2026-27 and the *Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for Admission to the MBBS Course, 2026*, notified vide Notification No. U-11021/24204/2026-UGMEB dated 27.07.2026.
2. Attention is also invited to Office Memorandum No. 18-25/2024-Policy dated 17.12.2025 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, regarding the validity of Temporary UDID Cards/Disability Certificates for extending statutory benefits to eligible persons with benchmark disabilities.
3. Accordingly, for admission to the **Undergraduate ASU Courses (BAMS/BUMS/BSMS)** under the PwBD category, the provisions of the aforesaid Guidelines dated 27.07.2026 shall be taken into consideration, as applicable, and read harmoniously with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the aforesaid Office Memorandum dated 17.12.2025.
4. Therefore, for the purposes of admission to the Undergraduate ASU Courses:
 - (i) A candidate shall not be denied consideration solely on the ground that the UDID Card or Disability Certificate is temporary, where the disability is categorized as "progressive, non-progressive or not likely to improve", subject to verification by the Medical Assessment Board.
 - (ii) In cases of candidates holding Temporary UDID Cards where the disability condition is recorded as "likely to improve", the Medical Assessment Board shall re-assess the benchmark disability as per the applicable assessment methodology prescribed by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), including the methodology prescribed vide Notification dated 12.03.2024.
 - (iii) The Medical Assessment Board shall independently assess the candidate's functional competency in accordance with the applicable PwBD assessment provisions before issuing the requisite Eligibility Certificate.
5. This clarification is issued to ensure uniform implementation in respect of PwBD candidates seeking admission to BAMS/BUMS/BSMS Courses and shall be read as an integral part of the applicable admission provisions for the academic session 2026-27.
6. This issues with the approval of the Competent Authority.

**GUIDELINES ON ASSESSMENT OF PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES (PwBD) FOR
ADMISSION TO THE MBBS COURSE, 2026**

U-11021/24204/2026-UGMEB-In exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 24 of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, read with Section 57 thereof, and in furtherance of the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2023, the National Medical Commission hereby issues the following Guidelines, namely: —

1. Short Title and Commencement

1.1 These Guidelines may be called the "Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for Admission to the MBBS Course, 2026".

1.2 They shall come into force on the date of their publication by the National Medical Commission.

2. Objectives

2.1 The National Medical Commission recognizes that Persons with Benchmark Disabilities constitute an integral part of society and are entitled to equality, dignity, non-discrimination and reasonable accommodation in all spheres of life, including medical education, in accordance with the Constitution of India and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

2.2 Simultaneously, the National Medical Commission is entrusted with the statutory responsibility of maintaining high standards of undergraduate medical education and ensuring that every medical graduate acquires the essential competencies necessary for the safe, ethical and effective practice of modern medicine in accordance with the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum.

2.3 Medical education demands the acquisition of knowledge, professional skills, clinical competencies, communication abilities and ethical values. The assessment of candidates with benchmark disabilities must therefore balance the rights guaranteed under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 with the statutory obligation to maintain academic standards, professional competence and patient safety.

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2.4 These Guidelines introduce a competency-based and function-oriented assessment framework, whereby the determination of eligibility shall not rest solely upon the numerical percentage or category of disability reflected in the UDID Card or other disability certification. While the benchmark disability prescribed under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 shall continue to determine eligibility for reservation under the PwBD category, admission to the MBBS Course shall be based upon an objective evaluation of the candidate's functional competencies, with due regard to reasonable accommodation, assistive technology, environmental accessibility and contemporary advances in rehabilitation science.

2.5 For the purposes of these Guidelines, the certificate presently issued by the designated Medical Boards for admission to the MBBS Course, though commonly referred to as a "Disability Certificate", shall be known as the "Eligibility Certificate", as it is intended to certify the candidate's eligibility or otherwise for admission to the MBBS Course based on functional assessment rather than merely certifying the existence or extent of disability.

2.6 In order to facilitate greater accessibility, transparency and uniformity in the assessment process, the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, expanded the designated assessment centers from 16 (Sixteen) to 61 (Sixty One) across the country and any further expansion of such assessment boards will be notified by the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) from time to time. For the purposes of these Guidelines, all such designated Boards shall be referred to as the "Medical Assessment Boards", which shall undertake the functional assessment of candidates in accordance with these Guidelines.

2.7 These Guidelines accordingly establish a transparent, uniform, evidence-based and competency-oriented framework for the assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities seeking admission to the MBBS Course throughout the country, with the objective of ensuring equal opportunity while preserving academic standards, professional competence and patient safety.

3. Definitions

In these Guidelines, unless the context otherwise requires—

3.1 "Act" means the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 (30 of 2019).

3.2 "Medical Assessment Board" means an Assessment Board designated or constituted by the Medical Counselling Committee for assessing the functional competency and eligibility of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities for admission to the MBBS Course under these Guidelines.

3.3 "PwBD Candidate" means a person seeking admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) category through the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (Undergraduate) [NEET (UG)].

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3.4"CBME" means the Competency Based Medical Education curriculum prescribed by the National Medical Commission from time to time.

3.5"Competency" means the knowledge, skills, attitudes, values and professional behaviors prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education curriculum required to successfully complete the MBBS Course.

3.6 "Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)" means the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.

3.7"Disability Certificate" means the certificate issued by the Medical Assessment Board designated by the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) under the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, certifying the eligibility or otherwise of a Person with Benchmark Disability for admission to the MBBS Course in accordance with these Guidelines.

NOTE: For the purposes of these Guidelines, the certificate presently issued by the designated Medical Boards for admission to the MBBS Course, though commonly referred to as a **"Disability Certificate"**, shall be known as the **"Eligibility Certificate"**, as it is intended to certify the candidate's eligibility or otherwise for admission to the MBBS Course based on functional assessment rather than merely certifying the existence or extent of disability.

3.8"Essential Competencies" means the minimum competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education curriculum that every medical graduate is required to acquire for the safe and effective practice of medicine.

3.9"Functional Competency" means the demonstrated ability of a candidate, with or without reasonable accommodation or assistive technology, to acquire and perform the essential competencies required under the Competency Based Medical Education curriculum.

3.10"Graduate Medical Education Regulations" or "GMER" means the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2023, as amended from time to time.

3.11"Guidelines" means these Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for Admission to the MBBS Course, 2026.

3.12"Medical College" means a medical institution recognized under the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 for conducting the MBBS Course.

3.13"Medical Counselling Committee (MCC)" means the Medical Counselling Committee constituted by the Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.

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3.14 "National Medical Commission" or "NMC" means the National Medical Commission established under Section 3 of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019.

3.15 "NEET (UG)" means the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (Undergraduate) conducted for admission to undergraduate medical education in accordance with the applicable law.

3.16 "Notification of 12th March, 2024" means the Notification dated 12th March, 2024 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, published in the Gazette of India on 14th March, 2024.

3.17 "Person with Benchmark Disability" or "PwBD" shall have the same meaning as assigned to it under Section 2(r) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

3.18 "Reasonable Accommodation" shall have the same meaning as assigned to it under Section 2(y) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

3.19 "Rules" means the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017, as amended from time to time.

3.20 "Specified Disability" shall have the same meaning as assigned to it under the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

3.21 "State Counselling Authority" means the authority designated by the respective State Government or Union Territory Administration to conduct counselling for admission to the MBBS Course.

3.22 "Self-certified Affidavit" means the affidavit furnished by a candidate in the format prescribed in Schedule-I declaring the candidate's functional abilities and other particulars required under these Guidelines.

3.23 "Speaking Order" means a written order containing the reasons, findings and conclusions of the Medical Assessment Board in support of its decision.

3.24 "Reasoned Decision" means a decision supported by objective findings, functional assessment and reasons recorded in writing.

3.25 "UDID Card" means the Unique Disability Identity Card issued through the Unique Disability Identity (UDID) Portal by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.

CHAPTER I

PRELIMINARY

4. Scope and Application

4.1. These Guidelines shall apply to—

- (a) every candidate seeking admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) category;
- (b) every Medical College recognized under the National Medical Commission Act, 2019;
- (c) the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC);
- (d) all State Counselling Authorities;
- (e) all Medical Assessment Boards constituted for assessment of PwBD candidates; and
- (f) every authority or institution involved in the assessment, counselling, admission or certification of candidates under the PwBD category.

5. Objectives

5.1. The National Medical Commission recognizes that Persons with Benchmark Disabilities constitute an integral part of society and are entitled to equality, dignity, non-discrimination and reasonable accommodation in all spheres of life, including medical education, in accordance with the Constitution of India and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

5.2. Simultaneously, the National Medical Commission is entrusted with the statutory responsibility of maintaining high standards of undergraduate medical education and ensuring that every medical graduate acquires the essential competencies necessary for the safe, ethical and effective practice of modern medicine in accordance with the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum.

5.3. Medical education demands the acquisition of knowledge, professional skills, clinical competencies, communication abilities and ethical values. The assessment of candidates with benchmark disabilities must therefore balance the rights guaranteed under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 with the statutory obligation to maintain academic standards, professional competence and patient safety.

5.4. Disability shall not, by itself, constitute a ground for exclusion from medical education. Eligibility shall be determined through an objective assessment of the candidate's functional competencies, taking into consideration reasonable accommodation, assistive technology, environmental accessibility and contemporary advances in rehabilitation science.

5.5. These Guidelines seek to establish a transparent, uniform, evidence-based and competency-oriented framework for the assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities seeking admission to the MBBS Course throughout the country.

6. Statutory Framework

6.1. These Guidelines shall be read in conjunction with—

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- (a) the National Medical Commission Act, 2019;
- (b) the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016;
- (c) the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2023, as amended from time to time;
- (d) the Notification dated 12th March, 2024 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment;
- (e) all applicable Regulations, Guidelines, Notifications and Circulars issued by the National Medical Commission from time to time; and
- (f) all binding judgments, directions and orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and other competent Courts governing admission of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities to the MBBS Course.

7. Purpose

7.1 The purpose of these Guidelines is to—

- (a) establish a uniform national framework for assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities seeking admission to the MBBS Course;
- (b) ensure transparency, consistency and objectivity in disability assessment;
- (c) facilitate implementation of the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2023;
- (d) ensure compliance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016;
- (e) promote equality, inclusion and reasonable accommodation while preserving patient safety and academic standards.

8. Equality and Non-Discrimination

- a. The minimum degree of disability should be 40% (Benchmark Disability) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability. Every PwBD candidate possessing a specified disability shall be entitled to equal treatment throughout the admission process.
- b. No authority shall discriminate against any PwBD candidate solely by reason of disability.
- c. Disability shall never be treated as a disqualification unless such disability demonstrably prevents the acquisition of essential competencies despite reasonable accommodation.
- d. Disability shall be understood in accordance with the rights recognized under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

- e. Assessment shall recognize that disability arises from the interaction between an individual's impairment and environmental, institutional, social and attitudinal barriers.
- f. Efforts should be made to the extent to which reasonable accommodation, assistive technology and accessible educational practices, that can enable the candidate to successfully pursue medical education.

CHAPTER II

ELIGIBILITY, DOCUMENTATION AND DISABILITY ASSESSMENT

9. Eligibility and Documentation

9.1 A candidate seeking admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) category shall possess a benchmark disability of not less than forty per cent (40%), in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the rules made thereunder.

9.2 Every such candidate shall possess a valid Permanent Unique Disability Identity (UDID) Card issued through the UDID Portal by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India. The UDID Card shall serve as the primary documentary evidence of the existence, nature and extent of the specified disability for the purposes of these Guidelines.

9.3 While the particulars recorded in the Permanent UDID Card, including the category, percentage and validity of the specified disability, shall ordinarily form the basis of consideration by the Medical Assessment Board, the Board shall independently determine the candidate's functional competency in accordance with these Guidelines. The determination of eligibility shall not be based solely upon the category or percentage of disability recorded in the UDID Card.

9.4 Where the Medical Assessment Board considers it necessary for determining the functional competency of the candidate or the feasibility of providing reasonable accommodation, it may require the candidate to undergo such further clinical examination, functional evaluation or verification as it considers appropriate.

9.5 Every candidate shall submit a self-certified affidavit declaring his or her functional abilities in the format specified in **Schedule-I**, which shall be verified by the Medical Assessment Board during the course of assessment.

9.6 A candidate shall not be denied consideration under the PwBD category solely on account of a procedural defect or discrepancy in the Permanent UDID Card, provided that

such defect is capable of rectification and the specified disability is otherwise established in accordance with law.

9.7 Every admission to the MBBS Course under the PwBD category shall be regulated by these Guidelines, and every Medical College, Counselling Authority and Medical Assessment Board shall ensure strict compliance with the provisions contained herein.

10. Medical Assessment Board

10.1 Every Medical Assessment Board shall discharge its functions fairly, objectively, transparently and in accordance with the principles of natural justice, equity and the rule of law.

10.2 Every candidate appearing before the Medical Assessment Board shall be treated with dignity, respect and fairness throughout the assessment process.

10.3 The Medical Assessment Board shall ensure that no candidate is subjected to physical, environmental, communication or attitudinal barriers during the assessment process.

10.4 The Medical Assessment Board shall undertake the assessment of candidates in accordance with—

- (a) the assessment methodology prescribed under the Notification dated 12th March, 2024 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment;
- (b) these Guidelines; and
- (c) any other applicable statutory provisions governing the assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities.

11. Matters to be Verified and Evaluated

11.1 While assessing the eligibility of a candidate under these Guidelines, the Medical Assessment Board shall verify and evaluate, inter alia—

- (a) the Permanent Unique Disability Identity (UDID) Card issued by the competent authority under the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment;
- (b) the nature, extent and stability of the specified disability and the underlying medical condition;

- (c) the candidate's functional abilities in relation to the essential competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum;
- (d) the suitability and effectiveness of any assistive device, assistive technology or adaptive aid used by the candidate;
- (e) the feasibility of providing reasonable accommodation to facilitate acquisition of the prescribed competencies;
- (f) the impact, if any, of the disability upon patient safety; and
- (g) such other clinical, functional or educational factors as may be relevant for determining the candidate's eligibility under these Guidelines.

11.2 Principles Governing Determination of Eligibility

The determination of eligibility by the Medical Assessment Board shall be guided by the following principles—

(a) Functional Competency

The primary consideration shall be whether the candidate possesses, or can reasonably acquire with appropriate support and reasonable accommodation, the essential competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum.

(b) Individualized Assessment

Every assessment shall be individualized, objective and evidence-based. No candidate shall be declared eligible or ineligible solely on account of the category or percentage of disability.

(c) Scientific Assessment

Assessment shall be based upon objective medical findings, scientific evidence, functional evaluation, contemporary rehabilitation principles and evidence-based medical practice. The Medical Assessment Board shall avoid reliance upon outdated medical opinions, stereotypes or unsupported assumptions relating to disability. Where advances in rehabilitation medicine, assistive technology or adaptive devices substantially improve the functional abilities of the candidate, due consideration shall be given to such advancements while determining eligibility.

(d) Reasonable Accommodation

Prior to declaring a candidate ineligible, the Medical Assessment Board shall examine whether reasonable accommodation, assistive technology, adaptive devices or appropriate infrastructural support would enable the candidate to successfully pursue and complete the MBBS Course without compromising the acquisition of the prescribed competencies.

Provision of reasonable accommodation shall not be construed as dilution of academic standards but shall constitute a measure to ensure substantive equality of opportunity for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities.

Reasonable accommodation may include, inter alia—

- (i) assistive devices;
- (ii) adaptive equipment;
- (iii) digital accessibility;
- (iv) accessible teaching and learning material;
- (v) communication support;
- (vi) ergonomic modifications;
- (vii) examination accommodations consistent with academic standards; and
- (viii) accessible clinical learning environments.

(e) Patient Safety

Patient safety shall remain an important consideration while determining eligibility. However, any conclusion relating to patient safety shall be based upon objective clinical and functional evidence and shall not rest upon generalized assumptions, stereotypes or preconceived notions regarding disability.

Chapter-III

Procedure for issuance of Certificate to the PwBD Candidate and Review Mechanism

12. Procedure for issuance of Certificate to the PwBD Candidate

12.1 Upon completion of the functional assessment, the Medical Assessment Board shall determine whether the candidate is Eligible; Eligible with Reasonable Accommodation, or Ineligible for admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) category in accordance with these Guidelines.

12.2 The determination of eligibility shall be based on—

- (a) the candidate's demonstrated functional competency in relation to the essential competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum;
- (b) the feasibility of providing reasonable accommodation, assistive technology or other support measures, wherever appropriate;

(c) the ability of the candidate to successfully complete the MBBS Course and acquire the prescribed competencies; and

(d) considerations relating to patient safety, supported by objective medical and functional evidence.

12.3 No candidate shall be declared ineligible solely on the basis of—

(a) the diagnosis or category of disability;

(b) the percentage of benchmark disability recorded in the UDID Card or Disability Certificate; or

(c) generalized assumptions or stereotypes associated with any disability.

12.4 A candidate shall be declared ineligible only where the Medical Assessment Board, after due consideration of reasonable accommodation and assistive technology, records, by a reasoned and speaking order, that the candidate is unable to acquire the essential competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum or that the disability would pose a demonstrable and unacceptable risk to patient safety which cannot be mitigated through reasonable accommodation.

12.5 Every determination of the Medical Assessment Board shall be recorded in writing and shall clearly specify—

(a) the nature and extent of the disability;

(b) the findings of the functional competency assessment;

(c) the reasonable accommodation, if any, considered or recommended;

(d) the reasons supporting the determination of eligibility or ineligibility; and

(e) the final recommendation of the Board.

12.6 The Medical Assessment Board shall issue an **Eligibility Certificate**, in the format specified in **Schedule-II**, certifying whether the candidate is—

(i) Eligible;

(ii) Eligible with Reasonable Accommodation, specifying the accommodation(s) recommended; or

(iii) Ineligible, together with the reasons recorded in accordance with clause 12.4.

13. Appellate Mechanism

13.1 Any candidate aggrieved by the findings or decision of the Medical Assessment Board may prefer an appeal before the **Appellate Authority** constituted by the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, within such time and in

such manner as may be notified by the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) from time to time.

13.2 The Appellate Authority shall independently examine the appeal and may, where considered necessary, call for the records of the Medical Assessment Board, direct a fresh medical assessment by an appropriate expert or specialist, seek additional medical opinion, or undertake such further examination as it deems fit in accordance with these Guidelines.

13.3 The Appellate Authority shall pass a reasoned and speaking order, clearly recording the basis for affirming, modifying, or setting aside the findings of the Medical Assessment Board.

13.4 The decision of the Appellate Authority shall be final for the purposes of counselling and admission under these Guidelines, subject to any order or direction of a court of competent jurisdiction.

CHAPTER IV

MISCELLANEOUS

14. Institutional Responsibilities

14.1 Every Medical College, Medical Counselling Committee, State Counselling Authority and Medical Assessment Board shall ensure that the provisions of these Guidelines are implemented in letter and spirit.

14.2 Every institution shall take appropriate measures to ensure that no PwBD candidate is denied admission or subjected to discrimination solely on the ground of disability, except in accordance with these Guidelines and the applicable statutory provisions.

14.3 Every institution shall endeavor to provide reasonable accommodation, barrier-free access and accessible learning environments in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the applicable standards notified by the Government of India.

14.4 Medical Colleges are encouraged to undertake periodic sensitization and capacity-building programmes for faculty members, administrative staff and students to promote an inclusive academic environment and eliminate physical, communication and attitudinal barriers.

14.5 Every Medical College shall designate a Nodal Officer or establish an appropriate institutional mechanism in the nature of an enabling unit to serve as a single point of contact to address the PwBD candidates seeking clinical accommodations and further to facilitate implementation of these Guidelines and to address various other issues concerning PwBD candidates. These measures reflect the institutional responsibilities emphasized under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

15. Grievance Redressal Mechanism

15.1 Every Medical College and Counselling Authority shall maintain an effective, accessible and time-bound grievance redressal mechanism for addressing complaints relating to disability assessment, denial of reasonable accommodation or any act of discrimination against PwBD candidates.

15.2 Every grievance shall be dealt with fairly, expeditiously and in accordance with the applicable provisions of law.

16. Compliance

16.1 Every admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities category shall be governed by these Guidelines.

16.2 Every authority concerned with the admission process shall strictly comply with these Guidelines.

16.3 No Medical Assessment Board shall declare a candidate ineligible without recording reasons in writing based upon functional assessment, scientific evidence and the principles contained in these Guidelines.

16.4 Every recommendation of the Medical Assessment Board shall be made by a reasoned and speaking order.

17. Power to Issue Clarifications

The National Medical Commission may issue such clarifications, advisories, standard operating procedures or procedural instructions, consistent with these Guidelines and the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, as may be necessary for their effective and uniform implementation.

18. Interpretation

If any question arises regarding the interpretation or implementation of these Guidelines, the matter shall be referred to the National Medical Commission whose decision thereon shall be final, subject to the provisions of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and any judgment or direction of a competent Court.

19. Repeal and Saving Clause

19.1 These Guidelines shall supersede all previous guidelines, advisories and instructions issued by the National Medical Commission or the erstwhile Medical Council of India relating to the assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities for admission to the MBBS Course, to the extent they are inconsistent with these Guidelines.

19.2 Notwithstanding such supersession, any action taken, assessment conducted or decision made under the earlier guidelines shall be deemed to have been validly taken or made insofar as it is not inconsistent with these Guidelines.

R

20. Overriding Principle

While implementing these Guidelines, every authority shall ensure that the assessment of a candidate is based upon functional competency, objective medical evidence and the possibility of reasonable accommodation. No candidate shall be denied consideration or declared ineligible solely on the basis of diagnosis, disability category or generalized assumptions regarding disability. The paramount considerations shall be equality of opportunity, maintenance of academic standards and patient safety, to be harmoniously applied in accordance with the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 and the Regulations and Guidelines framed thereunder and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgement delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain Vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-4121 wherein it was held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Residence' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government on the subject. Accordingly, it has been decided by the Government to revise the Government instructions referred to above as under:

From: Chief Secretary to Government of Punjab to all the Heads of the department etc.
Subject: Issuance of certificate for the purpose of seeking admission to various educational/technical/professional institutions in the state and also for employment.

Sir,

It has been brought to the notice of Government that educational authorities and institutions prescribe various certificates regarding residence, SC/BC category and backward area etc. to be furnished by the students/candidates with the applications forms for entrance examinations or employment in the formats and by the authorities different from those prescribed by the Government departments. Cases have also been reported where the authorities concerned insist on retaining original certificates and refuse to accept the attested photo copies of the certificates. All this results in harassment and panic among the students/candidates and their parents/guardian, since they have to apply with such certificates to more than one authorities simultaneously and within a limited period. The lists of certificates required at the time of applying for CET/PMET/PMT and PAU are enclosed by way of illustration.

2. In order to overcome the difficulty mentioned above, it has been decided by the Government that following procedure has been decided by the Government that the following procedure shall be followed meticulously by all the educational and other authorities concerned:-

- i) Certificates issued in the format and by the authorities prescribed by the Government Departments shall be accepted as valid by all educational institutions and other authorities.
- ii) Where a number of authorities have been authorized to issue the certificates there shall be no insistence on issue of a certificate by any particular authority or by the highest authority indicated in the format.
- iii)(a) In case of entrance examinations, no certificate should be called for in the first instance alongwith the application form. It will be sufficient for the candidate seeking admission or other facility to indicate in the application form whether he/she belongs to any particular category entitling him/her to certain concessions or facility. Requisite certificates may be obtained only from the selected/wait listed candidates.
- iii)(b) To further simplify the procedure attested copies of the certificates only shall be retained and original certificates if required to be produced at the time of interview shall be returned immediately, thereafter.
- iv) Parents/guardian or candidates can also obtain SC certificates from the Head of the institution where the candidates has studied if the proof is available in the school records.
- v) The persons who are employed in Government of India or any other State Government are to be treated at par with the employees of the Government of Punjab in the matter of issue of Scheduled Caste certificate provided relevant Scheduled Caste certificate exists in their service record. The Scheduled Caste certificate in such will be issued by the respective Heads of Departments in the Proforma below:-

Subject:- **Issue of Income & Assets certificate to Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for availing benefit of reservation in civil posts and services of Govt. of India and admission in Central educational institutions.**

Please refer to the subject cited above.

2. In pursuance of insertion of Article 15(6) and Article 16(6) in the Constitution of India vide the Constitution (One hundred and third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India has issued policy vide O.M. No.F.No.20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17.01.2019 to provide 10% reservation in civil posts and services in Govt. of India and admission in Educational Institutions to Economically Weaker sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and economically Backward Classes.
3. On the basis of O.M dated 17.01.2019, DoPT vide OM F. NO. 36039/01/2019-ESSt.(Res)-II dated 19.01.2019 has notified that 10% reservation would be provided for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) in central government posts and services. DoPT vide OM F. NO. 36039/01/2019-ESSt.(Res)-II dated 31.01.2019 has inter-alia issued detailed instructions regarding procedure for implementation of EWS reservation. The copies of the OM dated 19.01.2019 and OM 31.01.2019 is available on the link <https://dopt.gov.in/notifications/oms-and-orders> which may be referred to.
4. Similarly, Ministry of HRD vide OM F.No. 12-4/2019-U1 dated 17.01.2019 has issued instructions to provide reservation in admission to Central educational institutions. This OM is available on the link https://www.ugc.ac.in/ugc_notices.aspx.
5. In view of these instructions, the following persons are eligible for being issued the Income & Assets Certificate for availing the benefit of reservation for Economically Weaker Sections for admission to Central Educational Institutions and for Central Govt. posts and Services:-
 - a) Persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation by Govt. of India for SCs, STs and OBCs and
 - b) Whose gross family income is below Rs. 8.00 lakh (Rs. Eight lacs only) per annum. Income shall include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.
 - c) All persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWSs, Irrespective of the family income:-

- i. 5 acres of Agricultural Land and above;
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- iv. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than notified municipalities.

d) The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

e) The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

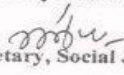
6. It has been decided that the applicant will present an application and self declaration as per Annexure-A and B respectively. The certificate will be issued as per specimen given in Annexure -C and will be valid for the financial year in which it is issued.

7. The concerned Tehsildar will be the Income and Assets Certificate issuing authority. He will issue the certificate after carefully verifying the claim and all relevant documents.

8. In special circumstances, the Deputy Commissioner may, by an order in writing, authorise the Sub-Divisional Magistrate of the area to issue the certificate.

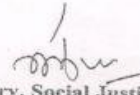
